The search for another city was soon narrowed down to Bangkok or Hong Kong. As President of the world's largest association of freight forwarding professionals, Mr. Yokeum knows Hong Kong well, and has long been impressed by the city's freight forwarding business environment.

"Infrastructure is the key to Hong Kong's success as a global transport hub," explains Mr. Yokeum. "It has an award-winning international airport, ports, the terminals, the warehousing facilities, the transport infrastructure – and a government that has created the ideal structure to support our industry."

Once the organisers had settled on Hong Kong, it was essential to find a suitable home among Hong Kong's various venues.


